

Environmental Policies of Italy


Italy is pushing initiatives designed to reduce black carbon emissions, particularly in the transportation sector.

In Italy we can see houses made of Pre-compressed straw which are beautiful, healthy, economical, anti-seismic and also fireproof.






Turin being eco
